Bruce will:

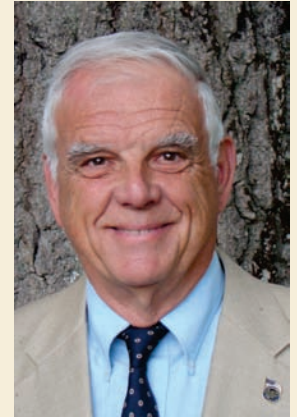
- Lead the development of a 10-year capital plan to forecast and pay for future projects and improvements
